## 2019 Course Offering

#### **First Period**

Jesus Unveiled Mel Stoltzfus - Cochranton, PA

Two thousand years ago Pontius Pilate, a Roman governor, asked Jesus Christ, "What is truth?" If Pilate would have waited for an answer he may likely have heard what Jesus claimed about himself in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." In this study we will focus on what Jesus said about himself in the Gospel of John. Is Jesus merely a role model or the Redeemer?

#### **Historical Perspectives on Current Issues**

History is to adults what parents are to children—it gives perspective and insight beyond our personal experience. In this class, perspectives from Anabaptist-Mennonite history will provide a backdrop for Bible-based discussions on current issues with the goal of illuminating the present and shining a light into the future. Issues considered will likely include nonconformity, revivalism, and maintaining faithfulness.

#### **Second Period**

**Knowing God**

Jesus prayed, "And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent" (John 17:3). This course is designed to take us deeper into the ocean of intimate acquaintance with God and the experience of His eternal life. Starting with the reality that "God Is" we will journey into several of His revealed attributes to know Him better.

#### **Scripture in Cultural Context**

The Scriptures are a treasure chest of historical insight and cultural references. This introductory course will expose foundations for exploring the Scriptures in their original context. Many passages, customs, and stories come alive when understood in their historical and cultural setting.

Women in ministry deal with the normal pressures of life, yet often with a unique twist. This class will explore relevant issues like friendships, getting along with other women in leadership, embracing one's calling, identifying misconceptions about ministry, maintaining vitality, being real, and loving well as a wife.

As pastors, we are called to be the primary example of how to speak "the truth in love" in our local congregation (Eph. 4:15). Neither truth nor love can be compromised if we are to biblically serve God's people. Following the example of our Savior, we can create a testimony that causes the world to marvel at how Christians "love one another."

With Genesis 1-11 and specifically 3:15 as a backdrop, it is God's redemptive plan that all men be saved through Jesus Christ. This is a study of God's initiation of redemption through Abraham's call and the covenant of grace established with him. The story continued through Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph as their faith was tested and matured. Today we are recipients of the Abrahamic covenant.
