Introduction to Greek

First Period

Elijah Yoder- Harrisonville, PA

The goal of this class is to gain a basic understanding of the Greek language so as to be better able to understand and use commentaries and resources based on the Greek text. We will study the basic structure of the Greek sentence, the Greek verb, and the Greek noun. The student will begin to learn how to grapple with the original language of God's revelation.

Romans: A Life Empowered by Grace (Chap. 9-16)

Paul begins his letter to the Romans with a systematic exposition of the doctrine of salvation (chap. 1-8) and God's response to Israel's rejection of the gospel (chap. 9-11) before concluding with practical application, "I beseech you therefore..." (chap. 12-16). After examining the implications of chapters 9-11, this course will explore what a life looks like that is fully committed to God.

Practical Church Life

Second Period

This course will explore practical issues of church life and administration. Subject areas will include ordination process, church structure and roles of leaders, financial support of the ministry, instruction class and baptism procedures, decision-making processes, and more. Class format will include lecture on background principle and concepts, but will also incorporate significant time for attendees to share and learn from each other as they respond to "How do you do it?"

We will look for practical applications to individual believers and churches throughout history. We will discuss the doctrine of Balaam, Nicolaitans, and Jezebel. Are those doctrines alive today?
